



Summer Camp Tuition, Registration, Policies

In striving to keep our summer camp prices low, we offer an “early bird” rate for those who register early. This helps us to be better prepared with staffing and materials. The “early bird” rate is applied in April, but camp tuition does go up in May and June.

Camp fees are non-refundable. Camp fees must be paid in full prior to the student participating in any summer camp. Summer camp tuition is non-transferrable, except within an immediate family.

Payment and registration must be complete in order to hold a spot for your student in a summer camp. Camps have limited enrollment and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

A camp registration is not complete until we have a completed registration form, tuition payment, and this signed policy agreement.

Other Fees

The tuition for the camp covers the cost of the camp and all materials needed with the exception of:

- Costumes: Soo Theatre Project provides some costuming. Students may be asked to provide basic pieces from home.
- Instrument rental, book, and supplies for beginning strings camp (this is the responsibility of each family).
- Food (*please remember to pack a lunch for day-camps*); Light snacks are available for purchase.

Sign-In/Sign-Out

In an effort to ensure the safety of all students, please note that students should be signed in and signed out every day by an authorized parent. Students may sign themselves in if the parent agrees in written form.

Preschool students must have a parent to sign them in and out and to be released.

If your student will be picked up by another parent, please notify the office by the beginning of the camp day in writing of this arrangement. Please include the date, name of the camper, and the name and phone number of the person your student should be released to. Attendance & Student Illness

When you sign up for a summer camp, it is important that you plan to be at all days/times listed. No reduction or pro-rating is made on tuition if a student misses a portion of camp. If your student has a conflict that requires coming late or leaving early, please inquire at the office if this would be acceptable to the director of the camp. If your student does have an appointment that conflicts with camp days/times, please notify the office a day in advance. Please make every effort to have your student to camp ready to start on time.

If your student becomes ill during camp, please keep them home until they are healthy. With so many people in one confined place, we would like to keep the rest of the campers and our staff healthy!

Instructional Contact

Instructional contact is defined as the teacher placing hands on the student for an educational purpose.
